



2021 RULES AND REGULATIONS - KING MACKEREL

1. Eligible fish: King Mackerel and Spanish Mackerel
2. Fishing begins at **6:30 AM** . Lines may not be in the water prior to that time.
3. No more than 6 lines per boat. All fish must be caught on rods and reels. No wire lines.
4. Once fishing lines have been deployed, you cannot pass any items to another boat, except in emergency situations.
5. Only one grand prize award per boat/per species.
6. All fish may be subject to Tory Meter test and/or to be cut open for inspection. If any lead/foreign material is found, fish will be disqualified.
7. All decisions made by the rules committee and/or grievance committee are final. Any protest must be submitted in writing with applicable protest fee (\$75.00) to the committee chairman within 30 minutes after the last boat is weighed in.
8. This is a one day fishing tournament. If the National Weather Service has issued any small craft advisory on VHF Channel 1 by their 5 am update for July 31st, the tournament will be postponed to August 1st. Again on Sunday, at 5 am, if any small craft advisory is in effect, the tournament will be canceled. It is the sole discretion of the captain to allow his vessel to fish. All captains and/or owners are responsible for their vessel and crew.
9. In the event the tournament is cancelled, all entry fees less \$60 per boat (KMT) or \$15 per angler (Inshore division) will be returned by check, via mail, within 30 days.
10. It is recommended that at least one member from each boat attend the captains meeting at the JIYC. Meeting starts at 7:00PM. Each competing boat will receive an ID number that will be necessary to weigh in. It is the captains' and/or owners' responsibility to become aware of clarifications or rule changes, by his or her attendance.
11. In the event of ties for awards, the earliest time of weigh-in will determine the winner.
12. **THERE IS NO RESTRICTION ON PORT OF EXIT OR RETURN** - Fishing to be within South Carolina state lines straight out from Little River (North) and Savannah River Ship Channel (South). Inshore species are to be caught in open navigational waters and estuaries. Inshore fish are not permitted to be caught from impoundments, salt ponds with damns or dykes, neighborhood lakes or areas with manmade restrictions to flow and boat traffic.
13. All fish must be weighed in at the official weigh station as designated by the JIYC committee. Offshore species must be brought in by boat.
14. Weigh in will take place from **3:00 – 5:00 PM Saturday or 2:00 - 4:00 PM Sunday (if Saturday Fishing was postponed)** on the day of the tournament. Any angler from the participating boat will be responsible for bringing the fish to be weighed, which were caught from that boat, to the weigh station, and removing all fish from the property.
15. Tying up to the dock will not be permitted so that others may also drop off. **Boat number must be presented to check in boat near the end of the pier. Boats will be staged in holding area until called to dock via VHF radio.**
16. Mutilated fish will not be accepted for weigh in and all fish shall be caught in open navigable waters. No fish shall be caught in a controlled body of water like an impound, diked ditch, salt pond or area with tidal flow control.
17. There will be a limit of one fish per species/per boat for offshore which will be accepted for weigh in. There will be a 36 inch minimum fork length for King Mackerel. Inshore rules will be based on an aggregate formula.
18. Anglers are encouraged to register online. Registration will be available at the Registration/Captain's meeting, or by mail to the James Island Yacht Club. It is the responsibility of the captain to verify mail registrations with the Tournament Committee.
19. Tournament committee reserves the right to change rules based on weather, or any other circumstances or reason it sees fit, at any time.
20. Adherence to all State and Federal Laws as they pertain to the eligible species is the sole responsibility of the Angler.
21. Tournament VHF channel will be : # 72. All KMT Boats must have a vhf with channel 16 and 72.

23. Registration closes onsite at the conclusion of the Captain's meeting. No late registration after
24. You must provide Social security number to receive cash prizes.
25. Southern King Fish Association rules apply to the King Mackerel Tournament.





INSHORE TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Eligible fish: Inshore Species: Sea Trout, Sheepshead, Redfish, Flounder and Spanish Mackerel
2. Fishing begins at **6:30 AM**. Lines may not be in the water prior to that time.
3. No more than 6 lines per boat. All fish must be caught on rods and reels. No wire lines.
4. Once fishing lines have been deployed, you cannot pass any items to another boat, except in emergency situations.
5. Only one grand prize award per boat/per species.
6. This is a no kill format. Angler can choose to harvest a legal fish. There will be no weigh in required, however, we can do courtesy weigh ins.
7. All decisions made by the rules committee and/or grievance committee are final. Any protest must be submitted in writing with applicable protest fee (\$75.00) to the committee chairman within 30 minutes after the last boat is weighed in.

*** Anglers will be given a special card with a number designated to their boat. Pictures must be provided for each catch
 Top 5 anglers must provide picture proof of each catch showing their number in picture.

RULES:

1. **Scoring** - All scoring will be done on the Angler's honor. Each angler will turn in a signed score card to a tournament official no later than 5:00 pm.
2. **Minimum Size**. In order to be recorded as catches, certain species of fish must have a minimum length as outlined on the score card and SC DNR Regulations.
3. **Maximum Number Per Species** - Only five (5) fish per species may be scored per angler.
4. **Point System**. Points will be awarded at the point value given to each species as noted on the scorecard and will be multiplied depending on the method of catch: bait X 1, artificial X 2, and fly X 3. Anglers may try to increase their point totals by catching multiple fish of the same species using different tackle, but only five fish per species will count towards the total.
5. **Species Bonus Points** will be added to the day's total for each different qualifying species scored above two species. For instance, 3 species = 150 bonus points, 4 species = 200 bonus points. In the artificial and flyfishing categories, baits should be "pure lures" without natural bait parts added.
6. **Photographs** – a Cell phone picture of each fish with the tournament Identifier and angler number will be required for top 5 anglers once points are tallied.



Spear Fishing Lionfish Rodeo Tournament Rules

Eligible fish: Lionfish

1. Spear Fishing begins at **6:30 AM**. Divers may not be in the water prior to that time.
2. No more than one spear gun per angler. All fish must be harvested by spear or Hawaiian sling. No bang sticks please.
3. Once divers have been deployed, you cannot pass any items to another boat, except in emergency situations.
4. Winner will be determined by total weight turned in. This is the honor system so no consolidating of catches.
5. All fish may be subject to Torgy Meter test and/or to be cut open for inspection. If any lead/foreign material is found, fish will be disqualified.
6. Tournament pays top three places based on weigh of whole fish.
7. Lionfish must be removed from premises after weigh in.
8. All decisions made by the rules committee and/or grievance committee are final. Any protest must be submitted in writing with applicable protest fee (\$75.00) to the committee chairman within 30 minutes after the last fish is weighed in.
